I would also add that the support of Ian Sutcliffe, Brian Saunders (and his sons, when available), Adrian Bryant and others helped make the season work and allowed all of us to enjoy our cricket when we got the chance to play!

I have two selections from the season – player of the season and colt of the season. Player is easier because he demonstrated his love of the game, worked hard to improve throughout the season and helped us win two matches with his batting – Paul Danbury for getting crucial runs and key wickets, plus setting an example in the field. As for colt, this was harder because they all excelled at some time.
